



Camp Trivera Rental Fees For Girl Scout Troops & Service Units

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RESERVATION INFORMATION

Thank you for your interest in Camp Trivera. As you plan for your stay, please be sure that you have the following information available prior to making a reservation:

- Desired arrival and departure dates (a second or third choice of dates is great too)
- Expected number of registered adults (male/female), girl scouts and tagalongs (non Girl Scout children). All adults must be registered, and background checked.
- Total Anticipated Number Attending
- Emergency Contact (other than person in charge)
- First Aid Certified Adult (**required**)
- Girl Scout Troop Leader/Service Unit Manager Name
- Outdoor Trained Adult (**required**) (The Outdoor Trained adult must be a different adult than the certified First Aider as required by GSUSA)

Check in time for overnight use is after 4:00 PM and check out time is by 12:00 PM (noon). The gate will be closed outside of these times. If your group needs to check in earlier, this needs to be communicated with a Trivera representative two weeks before your rental date and will be approved on a case by case basis based on availability.

There will be a refundable cleaning deposit of \$100 due at booking. Half of your total cost is due at booking and the remaining balance is due 14 days prior to check-in.

Housing in the Lodge includes a pass for one of the following: OKC Zoo, Science Museum Oklahoma or the Native American Cultural Museum AND access to one "activity add-on" listed below. Site amenities include access to restrooms, showers, the living rooms/lounges, the STEM lab, the kitchen, laundry facilities, interactive features on the 1 st floor, the Gathering Hall, training rooms, the sports court, the outdoor trails, and the amphitheater. When multiple groups are on site at the same time, a council staffer will help coordinate when groups may utilize certain areas of the property, but sharing should be anticipated.					
<p>Bunkrooms</p> <p>Each bunkroom sleeps up to 8 people – there are 3 bunk room types. 8-person bunk: 4 bunk beds along the outer walls. 6-person bunk: 2 twin beds and a loft for 4 girls. 2-person bunk: 2 twin beds and private bathroom. Bunkrooms are all on the second floor, have multiple electrical outlets and are private spaces with a door to each room. <p style="text-align: center;">Hammock Porch</p> <p>The hammock porch is on the second floor of the building. It is an open air, covered space with electrical outlets and access to a locked storage bin for each camper. Hammocks are provided for participants, and there is a private fireplace on the porch that is only for the use of these hammock campers. Dream Deck also has overhead heat and fans. <p>Housing outside of the Lodge includes access to one “activity add-on” listed below. Site amenities include access to the indoor restrooms, the showers, the STEM lab, the interactive features on the 1st floor, the Gathering Hall, the sports court, the training rooms, the outdoor trails, and the amphitheater. When multiple groups are on site at the same time, a council staffer will help coordinate when groups may utilize areas of the property, but sharing should be anticipated.</p> <p>Renting a treehouse or a primitive campsite does NOT include access to the bunkrooms, the hammock porch, the lobbies/lounges, the laundry facilities. Use of the Kitchen is included with Treehouse Rental. Kitchen use can be added for an additional rental cost if renting Primitive Campsite. (see Add-On’s below). The ice machine in the kitchen is accessible to everyone. Bathrooms and showers are located by the pool, which can be a little bit of a walk for young girls at night.</p>					
<p style="text-align: center;">Treehouses</p> <p>Each treehouse sleeps 8 people in single cots placed around the cabin. Accessing the treehouses is via stairs and/or a ramp. The treehouses are open-air and do not have electricity. No open flames. <p align="center">Rock Wall</p> <p>The Gathering Hall at Trivera features a large artificial rock wall. In order to use the rock wall, an adult facilitating the activity must undergo a training and checkoff process with appropriately certified council staff. All gear that is used must be provided by Camp Trivera, no personal gear is permitted. Staff is available to run the rock wall if this is your selected activity.</p>	Grades 2-12, ages 7+ (no Daisies)		\$12	
<p align="center">Zip Line</p> <p>The zip line is a great opportunity to see the lake and the zoo from a totally new perspective! In order to use the zip line, appropriately certified council or zoo staff must be available. All gear that is used must be provided by Camp Trivera, no personal gear is permitted.</p>	Grades 2-12, ages 7+ (no Daisies)	<i>Not Currently Available</i>		
<p align="center">Archery</p> <p>The Archery range has compound bows, hay-bale targets and arm guards. A certified USA Archery instructor is required to use this program area. As an ACA accredited camp, participants may not bring/use their own gear – all arm guards, bows, arrows, targets, etc. used must be provided by Trivera.</p>	Grades 2-12, ages 7+ (no Daisies)	20 people, 6 shooting at a time	\$3/person	<i>Not Currently Available</i>
<p align="center">Canoeing</p> <p>Brownies through Ambassadors can participate without an adult in their canoe. Daisies can participate only if an adult is in a boat with them. An adult certified as an American Red Cross Lifeguard with the Waterfront module is required to lead the activity (must be out on the water with the participants), and all participants are required to wear lifejackets, regardless of swimming ability. As an ACA accredited camp, participants must use the paddles, PFD's, boats and safety gear provided by Trivera; personal gear and boats are not permitted. User groups are required to provide watchers at all water activities-please review Safety Activity Checkpoints for the required ratios. Certified staff are available to run this activity if it is your selected activity.</p>	Grades K-12, ages 5+	24 people	\$5/person	
<p align="center">Fishing</p> <p>All Girl Scout levels can participate in Fishing on the lake at Camp Trivera. An adult who is certified as an American Red Cross Basic Water Rescuer OR American Red Cross Lifeguard with the Waterfront module is required to supervise the activity at all times. All who will be fishing are required to have a current fishing license issued by the correct governing body. Fishing poles and line are provided, any desired bait must be provided by the participants.</p>	Grades K-12, ages 5+	10 people	\$2/person	
<p align="center">Pool Swimming</p> <p>Swimming at the Camp Trivera pool requires one adult certified as an American Red Cross Lifeguard for every 25 swimmers. Beyond 25 swimmers requires additional certified Lifeguards. Group must follow ratio requirements outlined by the American Red Cross. User groups are required to provide watchers at all water activities-please review Safety Activity Checkpoints for the required ratios. The pool is typically open from late April to the last week of September, weather permitting. The pool is not heated. Certified staff are available to run this activity if it is your selected activity.</p>	Grades K-12, ages 5+	50 people (requires minimum of 2 certified Lifeguards)	\$3/person	
<p align="center">Cookout Equipment</p> <p>Chuck boxes are somewhat-mobile boxes of cookout equipment. They come with the following items: 1 large pot, 1 small pot, tongs, 2 frying pans, cookie sheet, cutting boards, eating utensils, plates/bowls, serving utensils, can opener, spatulas, a pitcher, dish soap, and a few other items. No food items are provided (no spices, oils, etc.).</p>	Grades K-12, ages 5+	8 complete boxes	\$20/box	

ACTIVITY AREA NOTES

The capacity for each activity area is firm due to accreditation restrictions, GSUSA ratio restrictions or equipment restrictions. Large rental groups should plan on scheduling activities multiple times throughout their stay for activities with smaller capacities to accommodate activity capacities.

Please note that renting areas of the camp property does NOT include access to certain activity areas. Most activity areas and use of equipment in those areas is an add-on to the normal rental cost, and groups must provide their own certified adults to supervise the activities, unless noted otherwise.

Please note that most waterfront and pool activities require a Lifeguard. The ratio of lifeguards to swimmers is 1:25. If you have a large rental group, only 25 people may be participating in lakefront or pool activities at a time unless the rental

group has multiple Lifeguards that meet the requirements of those activities. When filling out the rental application, if you have certified adults, you may use the pool at no additional charge and receive a discount on waterfront activities. Please submit the certifications required for the activities the group is requesting if you.

For instructional swimming activities, the rental group must provide a Lifeguard on deck at all times, beyond the swim instructor.
